

Red Rhino Progress and Programs

Purchased and Secured Land – 2005

- Purchased 5 acres of rural land twenty miles southeast of Nairobi, Kenya
- Secured Title Deed
- Built a fence around entire property
- Planted 10,000 acacia trees on the perimeter
- Completed a 5,000 cubic meter dam to collect and store seasonal rain water
- Purchased an additional 3 acres of adjacent land for future investment opportunities

Initiated an Immediate Impact on Local Area

- With the sponsorship of a Red Rhino family, our first employee, Wilson, priorly living solely off of farming, was given the opportunity to fulfill his dream of becoming a surgeon
- During Red Rhino Children's Home construction, several of our current children living at the rescued babies center gained sponsorships
- Established a twice weekly vegetable distribution network for orphans in Machakos
- To directly benefit the surrounding community, the number of local employees has grown immensely, leading to an increase in labor.
- Items such as, but not limited to, construction materials, medical supplies, a tractor, a generator, water tanks, clothing, educational materials, sport's equipment was received from the US in efforts to support Red Rhino.

Constructed the Red Rhino Children's Center

- Built a central kitchen/gathering/administration building
- Two children's homes with toilet blocks, showers, and a room for a house mother in each home are new additions to the center.
- Our resident staff now enjoys the luxury of two new homes.
- The Matron's house, the central caretaker of the children, is finished for use.
- Installed customized rainwater harvesting gutters for all buildings
- Designed a rainwater storage facility
- Created a soccer pitch and a basketball court
- Built a large workshop



Red Rhino Children's Center Opens August 10th, 2010

- Secured mandatory licenses with five agencies prior to opening
- Obtained NGO (Non-Governmental Organization) status
- A finalization of staff has been acquired and trained
- Introduced children to the Red Rhino Children's Center
- Signed official committal papers adopting children as our own
- The children were excitedly introduced to their new homes
- Enrolled children in a private elementary school
- Achieved certification as an officially registered children's home with the Kenyan government
- Launched Sponsorship Program for children

Further Progress and Programs

- Completed addition to central kitchen/gathering/administration building by adding a study room
- Wilson becomes a medical doctor after 8 years
- Added two more small homes for older kids when they are ready to live on their own
- Started the Community Schools Project educating 30 of the poorest children from the surrounding community
- Began feeding nearly 200 children at the neighboring school where our outreach kids attend (twice daily on school days).
- Initiated intensive and difficult Family Reunification Efforts for our kids
- Begin making uniforms for the Outreach Children to reduce costs
- Added 30 additional of the poorest children from our surrounding community bringing the Community School's Project to 60 children.
- Support of a Prison Outreach Program helping children of imprisoned women in Mombasa so that their children between 3-4 years of age, are able to go nursery school. The children live with their mothers in prison. We also help pay for counseling for the children and basic food supplies.
- 5 Community School's Outreach kids enter high school with many more to follow as we develop our
- The Red Rhino children begin tutoring the Outreach kids after school and on Saturday's and taking on their own projects to help "the poor" in their local community.
